
# Reopening Guidelines





### What we are doing:

- All entering our building will do so by reading the safety and health signs posted at all entrances. Entering our building is an individual's acknowledgment that they do not have symptoms associated with Covid-19.
- Common areas and frequently touched surfaces are cleaned regularly.
- Hand sanitizer is provided throughout the building.
- Posters are displayed with reminders on how to prevent the spread of germs.
- Seating arrangements in the building are revised to allow for social distancing.
- We will encourage all to be mindful and not congregate in high traffic areas i.e. hallways, lobby, etc.





### What you can do:

- Stay home if you are sick! Please join our livestream.
- When greeting others be mindful that some prefer not to hug and/or shake hands.
- Maintain social distancing practices.
- Wash your hands with soap frequently or use hand sanitizer
- Maintain cough etiquette.
- Talk to an elder/deacon if you have concerns specific to your circumstances, such as a health condition that places you or someone in your household at high risk.
- Be kind, gracious, and preferential towards others.

### Face Covering?

### Frequently asked questions

- What will you do if there's a positive Covid-19 case?
  - Despite all precautionary measures, there is always a risk of exposure to communicable diseases. Should someone contract Covid-19 and expose others in our church, we will immediately inform everyone of the possible exposure. Individuals with a positive test will be asked not to return until cleared by a medical professional. Individuals who have been potentially exposed will be asked not to return for 14 days. A thorough cleaning of the building will be conducted as soon as practical.





### What to expect

- Ushers will seat attendees before service.
  Families will sit together. There will be 2-3 empty seats between families.
- We will sit staggered in an alternate seating pattern to ensure social distancing.
- Those who desire to fellowship after service will be encouraged to do so outside of the building.
- As we reopen there will be no nursery or any Sunday School classes until further notice.
